

PROGRAMME CONTEXT

Massive tragedies caused by wars and hostilities in Europe, the Middle East and Africa, but also the aggravation of tensions in the Indo-Pacific and instability in Central and South America show us that all corners of the globe face violent conflicts or insecurity. These regional conflicts and crisis run in parallel with the accelerating great power competition, jeopardizing global trade relations and disrupting vital supply chains worldwide. All this indicates that the risk of a wider confrontation should not be underestimated. In the face of these threatening challenges, how can we avoid even more dire straits? How can we chart safe passages towards peace?

Large parts of humanity are rightfully longing for better living conditions and the reduction of global structural asymmetries. No part of the world is spared from the ramifications of human-made climate change. Refugees of war and natural catastrophes, along with migrants seeking a better life, reshape societies on all continents. National politics, regional organisations and the international multilateral order itself grapple with these new realities and the need to adjust to the new circumstances. How can we chart a safe course through these long-term challenges and bypass dire straits that hinder solutions?

The answer lies in building a new vision for the cooperation between the West and the Global South. This will require the overcoming of the simplistic division of the world in two camps, which are actually deeply interconnected vessels. For this reason, one of the main emphases of this year's Dubrovnik Forum is to provide a platform for an open exchange of views and practical ideas fostering that vision between the North and the South, the East and the West.

Another central emphasis of this year's Dubrovnik Forum will be the transatlantic community and the future of Europe. In 2024, crucial elections are being held on both sides of the Atlantic. First citizens, then elected politicians have to make serious choices with far-reaching impact on internal politics as well as on world affairs. What are the dire straits here, where are the safe passages? As in previous years, special focus will be devoted to the Western Balkans and their Euro-Atlantic path.

The unique feature of this year's Forum will be a discussion on the role of AI in diplomacy and global governance, alongside a dedicated event for young leaders and the special OECD Dubrovnik Talks. The Forum will convene in the historic city of Dubrovnik, a symbol of openness arising from Croatia's and Dubrovnik's longstanding role as a bridge between diverse cultures and peoples and its global merchant and seafaring tradition.
